

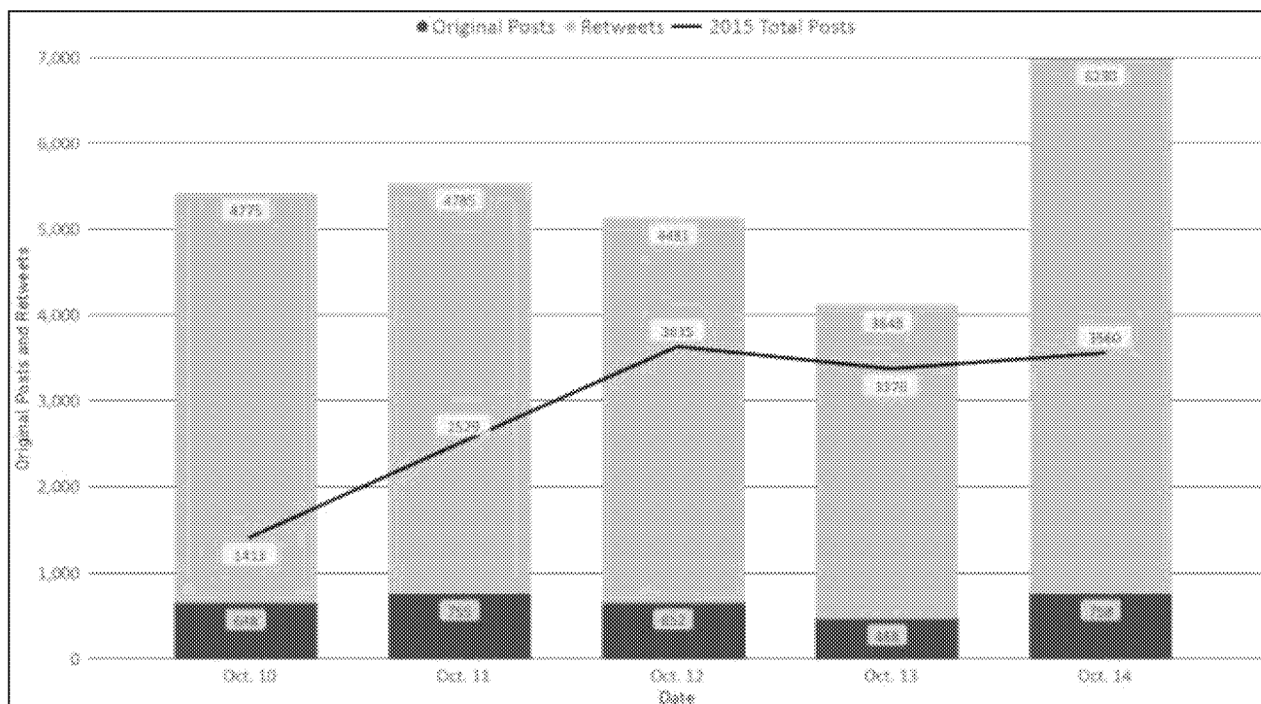
Rapport de repérage des médias sociaux : midi 14 octobre à midi 15 octobre, 2019

Social Media Monitoring Report: noon October 14 to noon October 15, 2019

Observations principales / Key observations

- Many users shared their positive experiences of voting at advance polls on social media; four high-profile users tweeted about their “fantastic” voting experiences, receiving a combined 10K engagements
- Some users reported issues at the polls related to long lines, accepted ID, accessibility and receiving service in French
- Facebook and Reddit users continued to share an unfounded viral story about alleged selective ballot tampering; someone posted it to ten different sub-reddits in quick succession

Sujets principaux / Key topics¹

Éléments sous observation / On the radar

- **Twitter user asked if there is a “black market for voter ID cards”:** The user (1.6K followers) asked “hypothetically” how much “one or two [voter ID cards] would sell for,” adding that they were “asking for a friend.” The tweet received eight engagements, with one user expressing interest in purchasing some in order to “get some extra votes for the conservatives.” Another user noted that their “girlfriends cousin” who is not a citizen had received a VIC and exclaimed that the “systems fucked, fucked beyond belief,” receiving nine engagements.
- **Twitter user concerned by lack of ID checking at polling station:** A user (694 followers) in Ontario said they were “bothered” by a poll worker’s lack of due diligence in checking their ID, saying they had only handed over their VIC, which also happened to feature their incorrect surname. The user said they had to “initial a form” to show that they had requested a name change, “but that was all.” The user added that poll workers “didn’t even look at my ID,” and “only asked if I had it.” The user concluded that “this feels highly suspicious.” The tweet received one engagement.
- **Twitter users unsatisfied with the demeanour of poll workers:** A user in BC (702 followers) said a poll worker had acted like an “officious bitch on a power trip,” after the worker told the user’s husband to “stay back” until the user was finished voting. The user was also annoyed that there was “no please, no smile, no ‘thanks for voting’” from the poll worker. The tweet received one engagement. Another user (588 followers) in Richmond East said there was a “lack of client care” from a poll worker helping “Chinese voters,” saying they failed to tell them to “mark with an X within the boundary.” The user chastised EC’s “scrutineers” for “not doing their jobs properly” and for expressing an “implicit bias.” The tweet received three engagements.
- **Elector claimed there was no “voting screen” at a Manitoba polling station:** In response to a Twitter user (11K followers) who said it was “strange” that polling stations had pencils for electors to use to mark their votes, a second user (192 followers) said they had no “screen,” and it was simply “two chairs on a folding table.” The tweet received no engagement.
- **Two users decried the lack of services in French at advance polling stations:** One user (557 followers) expressed disappointment in being served in English at an Orléans, ON, polling station, receiving one engagement. A user in Sudbury, ON (543 followers) was unhappy that they were

served in English even after having asked to be served in French. The user added that he voted « en français plus souvent à Toronto qu'à Sudbury », receiving eight engagements.

- **Four users posted inaccurate information about advance voting days, ID requirements:** A user posting on Facebook group “Winnipeg Indigenous Rock the Vote” (1.6K members) claimed advance polling would continue until “6pm” on “October 15,” receiving 26 engagements. On Twitter, a user (319 followers) claimed that voting at RO offices runs until “9pm Oct. 15,” later correcting themselves by stating that the deadline was, in fact, 6pm on October 15. A third user with 29 followers tweeted that “from what [they] hear” advance polls are open on October 15 “due to #mbstorm,” receiving one engagement from a user who asked what their source for the information was. On Twitter, *Milton Reporter* (82 followers) stated that EC offices are open until 6pm today and added that “all you need” to vote is “a valid photo ID and a voter information card.” The tweet received 4 engagements.
- **User claimed that VIS “does not give polling station information” for Squamish Nation reserves:** In a Twitter thread, a user with 5.8K followers said that they had no success finding the information, even after trying “multiple times.” The user mentioned that they had contacted “three election offices” and “none could fix the problem,” while also adding that the reserves are located in “three separate ridings.” In a later tweet, the user shared a screengrab of a document containing polling information for the Squamish Nation that they had received by “calling around.” The thread garnered 47 engagements.
- **Users continued to ask EC to investigate Greta Thunberg’s trip to Alberta as “foreign interference”:** A small number of users tweeted about Thunberg’s trip to Alberta and asked EC to investigate the environmentalist for election meddling, with one user stating that her appearance constituted “3rd party foreign interference” and another user asking EC to “stop” her from visiting Alberta.
- **User claiming to be a poll worker “pissed off” by accusations that poll workers engage in vote tampering:** In response to a post which called for voters to “use a pen” when marking their ballots, the user stated that they were a poll worker and were “pissed off” by the suggestion since it is “literally IMPOSSIBLE to change votes” given the several safeguards in place when handling the ballots and boxes. The post garnered 6 engagements.
- **Many users shared photos of marked ballots or photos taken inside the polling station:** Users on Twitter, Instagram and Facebook posted photos of themselves voting, of other people voting or lining up to vote, or of their marked or unmarked ballots. Many of the photos featured a ballot box with the box’s number clearly in sight. One photo featured a thick Sharpie marker that a user claimed to have used when marking their ballot, which was also pictured.
- **High-engagement tweet reminded users that EC does not call voters:** The user (1.4K followers) shared the recent “Election Day in Canada: When voter suppression came calling” documentary and added “Remember: Elections Canada won’t call you.” The tweet received 162 engagements.

There were several high-engagement tweets noting how easy advance voting is. *CBC Ideas* producer Nahlah Ayed stated that she voted “in under a minute” in a “quiet sunlit room” where she was greeted by “smiling election workers,” receiving 4K engagements. Shopify CEO Toby Lütke praised the accessibility of advance voting, adding that “Canadian Elections have perfect real-life [user experience]” and concluding by stating that “Elections Canada is a fantastic institution.” The band Arkells noted how cheerful staff at their polling station had been about a recent citizen voting for the first time in Canada. Singer Jann Arden announced that she had voted and urged others to do the same, receiving 2.4K engagements.

Other users expressed happiness over EC providing “four days straight of advance polls for an election, open each of those days from 9 a.m.–9 p.m.,” which made voting at an advance poll a “no brainer” for some. Other users were pleased that EC has measures in place to ensure that homeless Canadians can vote, and that poll workers had provided assistance for a legally blind elector. Many users also noted that it had taken them “less than 5 minutes” to vote, and a handful of users praised their polling location’s staff, describing them as “outstanding,” “helpful” and “top drawer.” A voter in Barrie was happy to use their Métis Nation ON Citizenship card as ID when voting.



Some users reported issues with the accessibility of their advance voting location, while a handful of users stated they had issues with their IDs being accepted. On Instagram, one user suggested that “voter suppression exists in Canada” since they had not received a VIC and had trouble using E-registration, adding that they were “not able” to register on the spot at their advance polling location. The user stated that in the end they were able to vote due to the “wonderful” poll workers “jump[ing] through a few loops.”


A handful of users reported issues with accessibility, ranging from no wheelchair ramps to lack of public transport to their polling station. One user reported that their polling location’s accessible signage was covered by EC’s yellow “VOTE” posters, making it difficult to find the accessible entrance, while another user shared video of a non-accessible disabled parking spot at their polling location which claimed to “meet 15 accessibility criteria,” calling it a “facepalm fail.” A third user noted that VIS and their VIC gave different polling locations for election day, adding that both locations have “ZERO wheelchair access,” and concluding that “I guess if you are wheelchair bound you stay home.” A third user in Montreal stated that they might submit a complaint due to their polling location being in a building that is under renovation and with no wheelchair access [#24077 Ville-Marie—Le Sud-Ouest—Île-des-Soeurs]. The LPC candidate for the riding, Marc Miller, also tweeted about lack of accessibility at the same polling location.



A voter in Inukjuak, Quebec [#24001 Abitibi—Baie-James—Nunavik—Eeyou] posted a photo of their VIC listing their advance polling station as located in Kuujuaq, and stated that they “wanted to be like every other person with the opportunity to go to an advance poll” but that it would require them to spend “thousands of dollars for [the] privilege,” adding that EC was “crappy.” The VIC showed the user’s election day polling station to be located in Inukjuak, Quebec.




Some users expressed suspicion and concern over the use of pencils to mark ballots and a handful of users questioned the chain of custody for ballot boxes. A high-engagement tweet noted that pencils can “easily be erased” adding that the use of pencils is “worrisome” since the RO takes the ballot box “HOME” at the end of the day. Another user noted that “election officials” take the ballot boxes home at the end of the day, prompting them to ask if Canada was “turning into a banana republic” like “Venezuela or Iraq,” and adding that they would vote on election day to ensure their ballot does not “go missing.”

One Facebook user found the use of pencils “unacceptable,” adding that they would bring a “pen or sharpie” when voting, to which other users replied that they would do the same. On Reddit, a user copied and pasted s. 161 (2) of the *Canada Elections Act*, noting that ballots can be marked with something other than a black pencil, and adding that everyone should vote with a pen since the scrutineers were likely to be “leftist women” who would alter ballots since “they believe CPC and PPC are Nazis.”

On Tumblr, two users discussed the reliability of advance voting, with one user expressing fear that advance ballots could be “lost” or “thrown away” since “at the end of the day it’s still a box of paper” which, according to the user, makes ballot boxes “essentially untraceable.” Another user engaging on the thread questioned the user’s concern and noted that advance votes are “listed in the vote counts from Elections Canada in every election.”

Social media users continued to share variants of an unsubstantiated and implausible account which first appeared on October 11 on the Reddit board r/metaCanada. In the post, a user claimed that at their Toronto-area polling place, poll workers “who barely spoke English” were looking at marked ballots and “spoiling” those not marked for the “ruling party.” Over the past 24 hours, two new Reddit users have posted the story into more than a dozen Reddit threads, many related to conspiracy theories and to U.S. President Donald Trump.

The new Reddit users shared a modified version of the October 11 r/metaCanada story, providing a link to a tweet that reads “Caution when voting: SOMETHING EVIL IS GOING ON IN TORONTO!” and “Crooked Liberal Elections Canada.” The tweet then urges users to “DON’T GIVE THEM YOUR BALLOT,” and to “PUT IT IN THE BOX YOURSELF.” The message then relays the original r/metaCanada story, but adds that it comes from “Linda H,” and not from Reddit. The Reddit poster went on to say that it’s “1st hand proof that Canada in drowning in tyranny. NWO is pulling all stops to keep Canadian citizens enslaved.” SMMU has found the story shared in the following Reddit boards: r/Conservative, r/conspiracy, r/trump, r/DrainTheSwamp, r/TheNewRight, r/conspiracyundone, r/Election, r/Canada_First, r/Liberate_Canada, r/PeoplesPartyofCanada and r/MetaCanadaTwo. The two Reddit users urged others to share said news across all social media platforms. Each post received between two and twenty engagements. The two Reddit users appear to be relative novices to posting Canadian-related content, and have mostly posted content that supports views expressed by U.S. President Trump.



In addition, a citizen news website called *Broadcasting-Live* that specializes in “unreleased, unedited, and suppressed news from major networks” has taken the original text from r/metaCanada and compiled it into a low-quality article. Groups like Yellow Vests Canada are now sharing the article frequently (518 times on Facebook). Users commenting on the article mentioned their suspicions about EC, and suggested ways to avoid ballot tampering, such as using a “sharpie marker,” “placing your ballot in a sealed envelope,” not allowing poll workers to rip off the counterfoil, and placing the ballot into the ballot box themselves.

Since the release of the October 11 r/metaCanada post, SMMU has observed a sharp rise in Facebook users urging others to “bring a pen” or “sharpie marker” to polling stations, citing rumours that poll workers were “caught smudging out Conservative X’s on ballots.”

Users continued commenting on broken, vandalized and stolen election signs. Vancouver Reddit users poked fun at vandalism of Burnaby–North Seymour PPC candidate Rocky Dong’s lawn sign. Vancouver South CPC candidate Wai Young claimed that over 30% of her signs have been “taken or vandalized.” On the Facebook group Canadian Conservatives United Against the Left, users discussed what political party signs they are seeing in their riding, with a handful commenting on “damaged or destroyed” CPC signs, as well as LPC signs “thrown in ditches.” In Ontario, one Twitter user reacted to Brampton South LPC candidate Sonia Sidhu’s stolen lawn signs, and accused the CPC of stealing their signs. In Napanee, a Twitter user reminded others that the penalty for damaging signs is “18 months behind bars.”

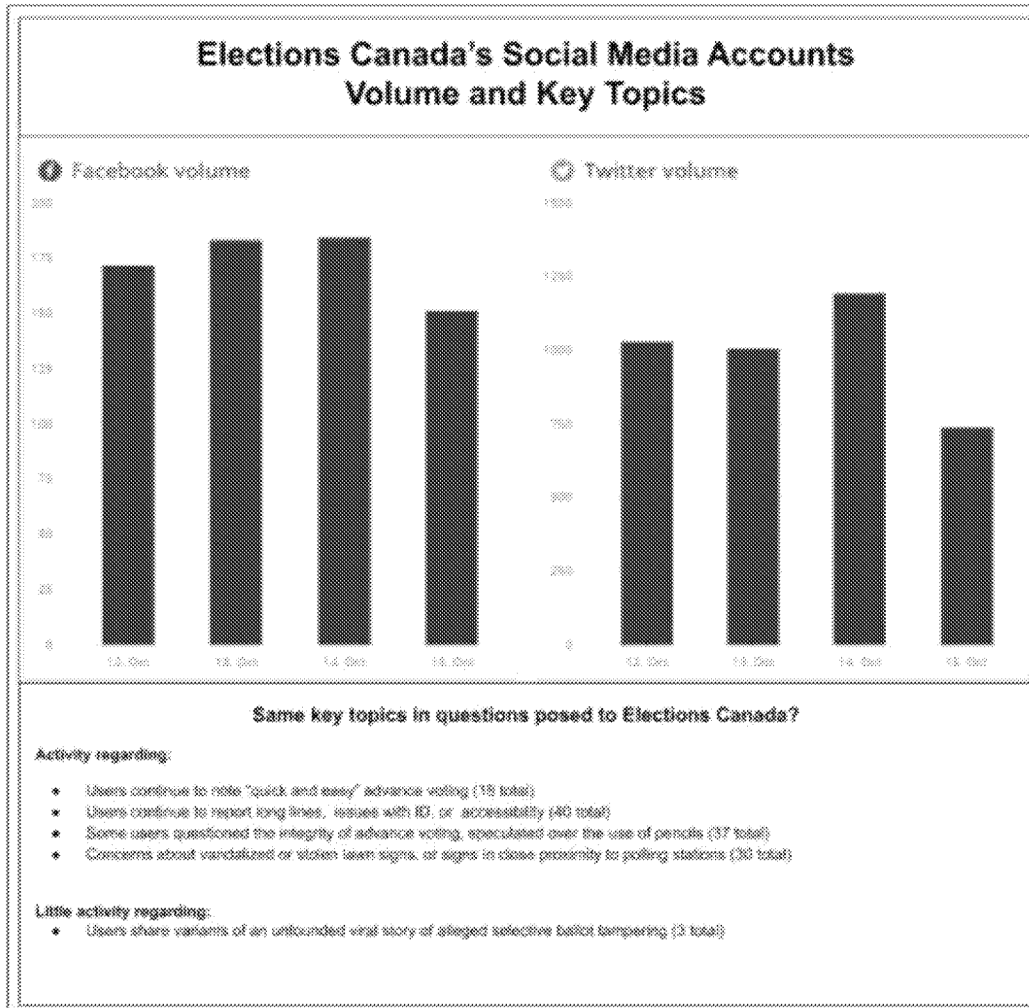
