

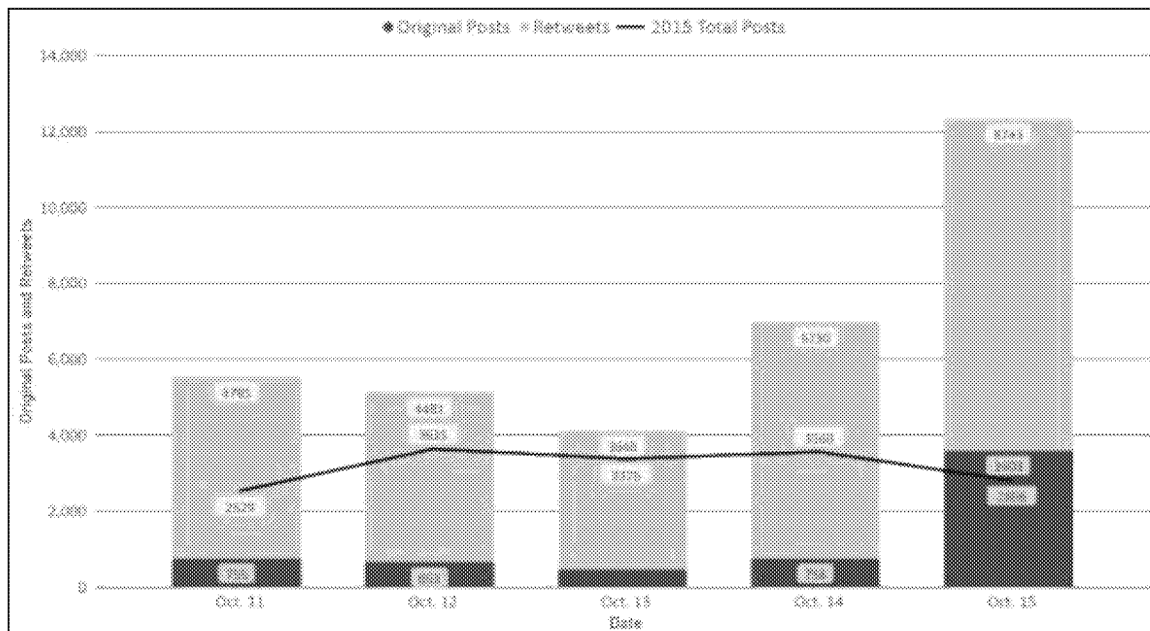
Rapport de repérage des médias sociaux : midi 15 octobre à midi 16 octobre, 2019

Social Media Monitoring Report: noon October 15 to noon October 16, 2019

Observations principales / Key observations

- Users reacted to news about the increase in advance poll turnout; some shared positive experiences, while a small number mentioned issues with accessibility at their polling locations
- Two recent *True North News* articles revived discussion about potential non-citizens on the NROE, with a handful of users calling for EC to be “investigated”
- Users continued discussing the use of pencils to mark ballots, with some announcing that they would bring a pen to polls to mark their ballot
- A video of a terminally-ill 18-year old who voted, asking others “#whatsyourexcuse?” garnered over 500K views on YouTube and inspired a new hashtag: #ivotedformaddison

Éléments sous observation / On the radar

- **Twitter user urged CPC voters to vote on October 21, “Liberals” and “NDPers” on October 22-23:** The user (1.3K followers) referenced the high turnout for advance polls, and posted a “new schedule” for “avoiding delays” on October 21; the “new schedule” stated that CPC voters vote on October 21, LPC voters on October 22 and NDP voters on October 23. The tweet received eight engagements.
- **Three users shared inaccurate information about polling locations available to voters before election day:** One Twitter user claimed that EC offices are open “until 9pm every day this week” for electors to “vote via special ballot.” Still on Twitter, another user with 3.3K followers called for electors in New Westminster–Burnaby who “didn’t make it to an advance poll” to vote at the riding’s EC office, receiving 14 engagements. On Reddit, a user also claimed that electors could vote on university campuses.
- **Terminally-ill Winnipeg elector urges others to vote, inspires #ivotedforMaddison hashtag:** In a video posted on Twitter and Facebook, the recently-diagnosed 18-year-old elector announced that she had voted and encouraged others to do the same. The video was shared by high profile users such as LPC leader Justin Trudeau and NDP leader Jagmeet Singh, and has been viewed over 500K times. A *Global News* article about the young elector’s video urged voters to “take a photo of themselves after they’ve voted” on October 21 and use the hashtag “#ivotedforMaddison” when posting on social media.
- **Poll clerk stated that they do not “approve of” working “four 12-hour days in a row” with limited breaks:** The user (104 followers) stated that they “approved” of extended advance polling hours for GE43, but that they did “not approve” of working long shifts with “only two 15-minute breaks each day.” The user added that they were aware they “quite literally signed up for [the long days]” but that they did not expect it to be “quite as horrible as it was.” The two tweets received no engagement.
- **Independent journalist said “civil suit needed” if EC does not act on *Time Magazine* story on LPC leader:** Following a Twitter user receiving an email, likely from the CCE, advising that they

would not investigate the *Time Magazine* “brownface” story, journalist Amy MacPherson (6K followers) stated that if she “understand[s] correctly, EC determined that foreign interference and fake news in Canadian politics is perfectly legal.” MacPherson suggested she is working on a new piece of investigative journalism that exposes said electoral interference, and that if EC “maintains the same stance, a civil suit will be needed.” The tweet received 152 engagements.

- **User tweeted a photo of a garbage receptacle, saying it’s EC’s new “special ballot box”:** A Twitter user with 246 followers posted a photo of a black garbage receptacle, and said EC has “added a special ballot box” for those voting PPC. “Make sure to find yours at your local polling station,” they added. The tweet received three engagements.
- **User called on EC to release survey research about GE43:** A Twitter user (675 followers), completing an apparent EC survey by Advanis, is calling on EC to release the results of the polling questions to the public. The tweet received 9 engagements.

Many users reacted to news of higher-than-ever advance poll turnout, with some sharing their positive experiences. One user noted that they were “in and out” in less than 10 minutes, while another praised the “hassle free” process of advance voting, adding that it took them “90 seconds” to cast their ballot.

Two users praised special ballot voting, with one mentioning that they were excited to vote from abroad since EC “has done a great job making [the] process efficient.” Another user mentioned that they had voted at an RO office, adding that they would “for sure” be doing so in the future. Overall, many users were delighted over increased advance voting opportunities for GE43, and praised EC for a job “well done.”

A handful of users reflected on their voting experiences at advance polls and mentioned issues with accessibility and line ups at their advance polling locations. One user noted that their advance polling location was “an hour’s walk” from their house, exclaiming that if it was not for election day polling, they would not be able to vote in GE43. Another user claimed that they and their wife went to vote at an advance poll, only to have their ballots mixed up by the poll workers; according to the user, the poll workers handed them their wife’s marked ballot by accident. A user in Vancouver East was unimpressed by the local RO office having “basically no signage,” stating that it was “not cool for a low income area.”

Users on Reddit page r/Winnipeg noted line ups at their advance polling locations, with one user stating that they chose to vote at an advance poll to avoid “clog[ging] up the line on election day” for those who could not vote in advance polls due to the storm in Manitoba.



Users continued speculating about the use of a pencil to mark a ballot and the integrity of advance voting. On Twitter, a handful of users, including PPC candidate Jeremy Lin (Markham Stouffville), encouraged voters to bring pens to mark their ballots. Lin also added that he had worked for EC "four times" and that pens at voting booths had "always been Sharpie[s]." Other users discussed the legality of using pens, with some noting that it is allowed under the *Canada Elections Act* and announcing that they would be bringing pens on election day to prevent their ballots from being "smudged" or "erased."

On Twitter, one user stated that they're "hearing Maxime already has 11% of the vote" and speculated if GE43 was the first time advance poll results were announced prior to election day. Another user replied that it was "just a rumor" since ballots are not "supposed to be counted before election day," to which the original poster replied by stating "supposed" and speculated over whether someone would "snoop and leak" the results. Another user, commenting on a Facebook post noting GE43's high advance poll turnout, stated that they "hoped" PPC votes cast at advance polls "actually get counted." A third user on Twitter called advance polls "weird" since they require voters to trust that their votes are "safe and secure" for a week.

In a thread on r/metaCanada, a user stated that they had just returned from "the CRO's office" and that there were "signs everywhere" stating that ballots could be marked in "PEN or PENCIL," dismissing the "big eraser conspiracy." A second user noted that the voting booths even had "bics tied" to them and sarcastically added "but bring yer sharpie!"

In this reporting period, there were fewer shares and comments on the unfounded story of selective ballot tampering which first appeared on Reddit on October 11. SMMU continues to discover new Facebook users sharing the story, but the story does not seem to be eliciting the same volume of comments and shares as it did a few days ago (from 400 to 600 shares on October 11-13, down to 5-20 shares on October 15). However, those who do share the story continue to urge others to "vote in pen" and to ensure poll workers do not touch their ballots. In the context of posts on this story, some users shared links to Elections Canada's web pages on safeguards. One user said: "upon reading this and comparing it to eligibility requirements announced on the news, I can still see the loopholes for fraud."



A number of Twitter users weighed in on two recent *True North News* articles about non-citizens receiving VICs, including a user in Ontario who said their “dead husband” received a VIC, and wondered if they should “bring his ashes on Oct 21?” Another user wrote a blog piece about the incident, and said EC needs a “thorough housecleaning, top-to-bottom,” with a “renewed focus on making sure only verified Canadians can vote.” A third user demanded that all non-citizens are off the NROE, or “someone at EC is going to jail toot suite,” with a fourth user adding that EC needs to be “criminally investigated for interference and fraud handing out voter cards to non-citizens.”

Still on Twitter, one user shared an October 8 *CBC News* article about a non-citizen in Beiseker, AB, receiving a VIC as “BREAKING NEWS,” to which another user replied that “they’re handing [VICs] out at Roxham Road.” PPC candidate Sarah Chung (Markham Unionville) shared a screengrab of a Facebook post written by the non-citizen in Beiseker, AB, adding “we do not want foreign interference” in GE43, while PPC candidate Jeremy Lin (Markham Stouffville) stated that he was “bothered” by vouching and Canada’s “lax” ID requirements.





While some users posted about election signs, overall, interest in this topic has decreased. Three PPC candidates in the greater Toronto area tweeted about vandalized or stolen lawn signs. PPC candidate Brenda Virtue said one of her “Double 4x4 foot election sign” was stolen in Durham. In Markham, local PPC candidates Jeremy Lin and Sarah Chung expressed annoyance at recent sign vandalism, with Lin noting that EC was “basically useless” in this regard. PPC candidate Lee Weisher also weighed in on vandalized signs, noting that a fellow PPC candidate in Lac Saint-Louis Gary Charles had “fascist” tagged on his sign. « Cette haine doit cesser. Pourquoi ne pouvons-nous pas avoir des discussions intellectuellement honnêtes? » said Weisher.

Twitter users commenting on a *CTV Kitchener* story about destroyed LPC signs in Perth–Wellington said “the same problem” was happening with LPC signs in Ottawa, and that CPC signs were also being destroyed in the riding. BC-based news site *The Breaker News* also tweeted about LPC signs, asking whether LPC candidate Catherine McKenna had “ditched” red for “Elections Canada” black and yellow. Finally, the LPC candidate for Calgary–Shepherd tweeted to EC to ask if their CPC competitor in the riding could place *The Rebel Media* “Libranos” lawn signs beside his.

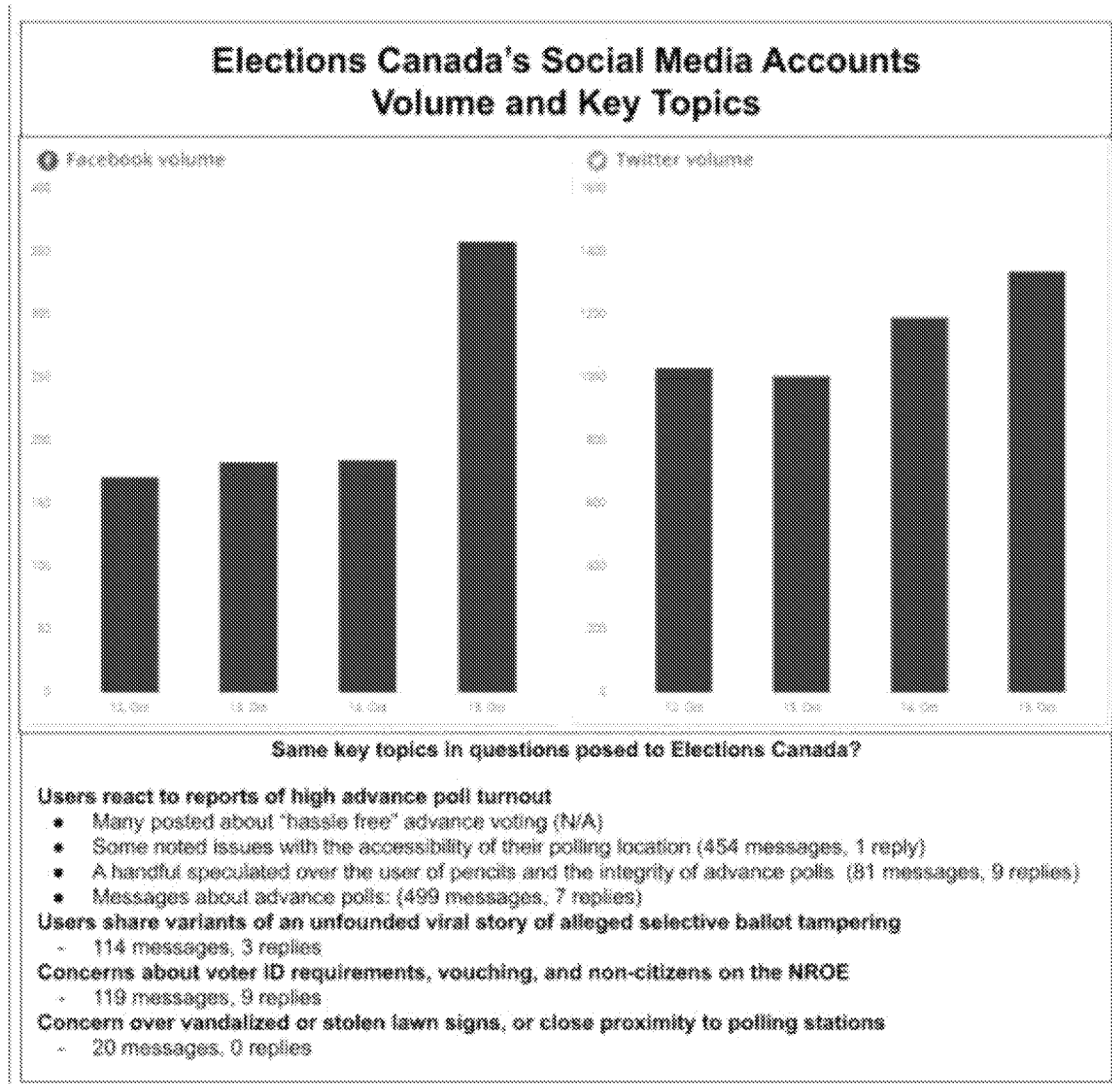
