

Rapport de repérage des médias sociaux : midi 23 septembre à midi 24 septembre, 2019 Social Media Monitoring Report: noon September 23 to noon September 24, 2019

Observations principales / Key observations

- 3K users shared a *Free the Press* article on the provenance of *Time's* "brownface" photo, with some calling on EC to investigate alleged foreign involvement
- Users continued to express confusion about whether voters need to register before they vote; one claimed EC's ad campaign promoting registration was a "ploy" to suppress the vote
- Users continued to comment on vandalized signs; some noted that it is illegal to tamper with signs and urged others to report vandalism to EC



Éléments sous observation / On the radar

- Twitter user raised concerns about vote counting process: A user with 1.9K followers questioned how votes are counted and wondered how to "verify" that your vote went to the candidate of your choice; according to the user, "the entire system" is based on "unverifiable trust" since information on "the company" that is used to "transmit" votes and the "margins of error" in each riding are not made public. In another tweet, the user claimed that Canada uses "machines" to "assign" votes and questioned who "programs" the machines. Another user weighed in on the thread and claimed that ballots are both scanned and hand-counted at the federal level. The exchange received fewer than 20 engagements.
- Twitter users urged one another to report "lies" by parties to EC: A small number of Twitter
 users reacted to partisan statements from the CPC's official account and stated that they would
 report the "LIES" to EC; a handful of users also shared the CCE's complaint form and urged
 others to file a complaint about the CPC's "false information" with "Elections Canada."

- Twitter user wondered if EC will "bring enough" ballots to First Nations communities: The user (328 followers) asked whether EC had plans to bring "enough ballots" to First Nations communities for GE43 and added that it would be "nice" if EC "didn't erase First Nations voters like last time." The tweet received two engagements.
- Dating app Bumble launched a voter registration initiative: The initiative, launched in collaboration with Apathy Is Boring, prompts users to identify whether they are registered to vote; if the user clicks "yes" they get an "I am a voter" badge added to their dating profile "to let their matches know they are committed to casting a ballot." The app does not provide a link to EC's website. Bumble is making a donation to Apathy Is Boring for every badge earned by its users, up to \$10K.



• Documentary on alleged foreign funding of environmental groups: A Twitter account called FAIR Elections Canada tweeted that it will be releasing a documentary in October that looks into "the foreign funding in Canada to landlock Canadian resources + influence election outcomes" and draws on the work of researcher and activist Vivian Kraus. The tweet linked to a site with a trailer: www.overabarreldoc.com.

A *Free the Press* article by freelance journalist Amy MacPherson claimed that *Time's* discovery of 2001 photos showing LPC Leader Justin Trudeau in "brownface" makeup is an example of "foreign interference" that warrants an EC investigation. MacPherson deemed it suspicious that "no Canadian media was approached with the original brownface scandal" and took issue with the U.S.-based *Time* magazine releasing the "bombshell exposé" during a Canadian election. She also claimed that *Time's* coverage of the 2001 photos was rife with ethics concerns and "lapses in professionalism" which warrant the media outlet to be investigated for "foreign election meddling for partisan purposes."

Twitter users quickly shared MacPherson's article; some asked EC to investigate the claims made by MacPherson, while others shared the CCE's complaint form and stated that they had filed a complaint with "Elections Canada." Many users repeated MacPherson's claim that the 2001 photos constitute "foreign interference," with one user adding that Canadian media were not covering MacPherson's claims since "Canadian intelligence officials" were "conferring" with the "election alert panel" [critical election incident public protocol group] to hide the "interference" and called on EC to investigate the panel.

Some Twitter users continued engaging with justice advocate Julie S. Lalonde's September 22 thread on voter registration. Inspired by Lalonde's thread, comedian Stewart Reynolds (26.1K followers) tweeted "you don't have to register to vote"; he later deleted the tweet and posted "you don't have to (pre) register to vote," adding that pre-registering will make voters' lives easier. A handful of other users restated Lalonde's claim, with one user adding that voter registration was a "ploy to keep people away from the voting booth." One user commenting on the topic urged others to register prior to going to the polls since it "cuts the wait in line for others."

Following a popular *Global News* article discussing lawn sign defacement (the most shared EC-related article of the writ period), a number of Twitter users, prominent journalists and candidates have chimed in with their own shared photos and stories of vandalized or threatening lawn signs. Some expressed concerns over threats of violence, as well as homophobic, sexist and racist language directed at candidates. Many users called on political parties and the public at large to condemn this kind of behaviour. However, a small number of users continue to posit such signs are simply a "bad joke."

A number of Twitter users commented on a photo of a lawn sign by Calgary–Centre NDP candidate Gurinder Singh Gill that was defaced with the words "go back MF..." Most users commenting on the photo said such vandalism was "disgusting," "cowardly" and "racist." Tweets referencing the Singh sign have received over 1K engagements in total. A user who compiled four photos of defaced lawn signs into a single tweet also received high engagement. In addition to the Singh Gill sign, the post included photos of a defaced LPC Karen Ludwig sign with two swastikas, an uprooted NDP Angella MacEwan sign and a broken LPC Haley Brown sign. The defaced Brown sign, however, appears to be from 2015.

Users are also commenting on Bloc Québecois candidate Simon Marchand's campaign signs, which appear to be strategically cut in half. Two users suggested that the sign was cut by members of Québec Solidaire, defacing the signs to include a link to Québec Solidaire's environmental policy platform website.

The Rebel Media is also delivering lawn signs for GE43, with Rebel staff handing out "Libranos" lawn signs that satirize the LPC Leader and LPC candidates in Sault St. Marie, ON. A number of Twitter users shared photos of their Libranos signs on Twitter, with fellow users asking the Rebel to come to their own hometowns to deliver signs.

The volume of posts on this topic declined. A small number of Twitter users continued weighing in on the CNP releasing its members' names on the party's website. In a response to a tweet on the topic, one user threatened a CNP member; the user stated that they had "found" one of the members from Chilliwack and added that the CNP member should "start praying." A handful of users continued sharing the list of names; one user urged others to "check" if they recognized any of the CNP members on the list, while Yellow Vests Canada Exposed claimed that CNP Leader Travis Patron had "literally copied and pasted" Anti-Racist Canada's list to the CNP's website.


A number of social media users re-shared a Cultural Action Party of Canada web post claiming that "264,000 voter registration cards" were sent to "DECEASED Canadians" and "illegal migrants." One Facebook user called for "all Canadians to be worried" by VICs qualifying as voter ID due to "around 270,000 VICs" being sent to "dead" voters in GE42, while another user stated that EC's inability to track whether a potential voter is a citizen is "scary" and a reflection of "poor management skills." One user stated that the person who sent "voting cards" to "fresh refugees" should be investigated and charged with "a serious crime." A handful of Twitter and Facebook users contended that the issue went beyond poor management and described the recent changes in voting ID requirements as an LPC attempt to "fix the election."
