Social Media Monitoring Report: September 8, 5pm – September 9, 5pm, 2021

Observations principales / Key observations

- Volume: Last 24h: 1.2K; Previous 7 days average: 1.1K posts/day; Previous 30 days average: 1.53K posts/day pre-campaign average: 100 posts/day
- On the eve of advanced polls, social media users have focused on voter identification, especially in the form of VICs that have not arrived, and in whether masking is enforced in polling places.
- Dread over potential conflicts or COVID outbreaks in polling places and fears of how mail in ballots will be handled and counted are all present in the environment. This is leading many social media users to say that EC seems unprepared.
- Voters who are skeptical of Elections Canada are planning to vote before Sept. 13 because they believe EC will forbid unvaccinated voters, or they believe they should only vote on election day because they do not trust advance polls. It is not clear which information spheres lead to the different conclusions.

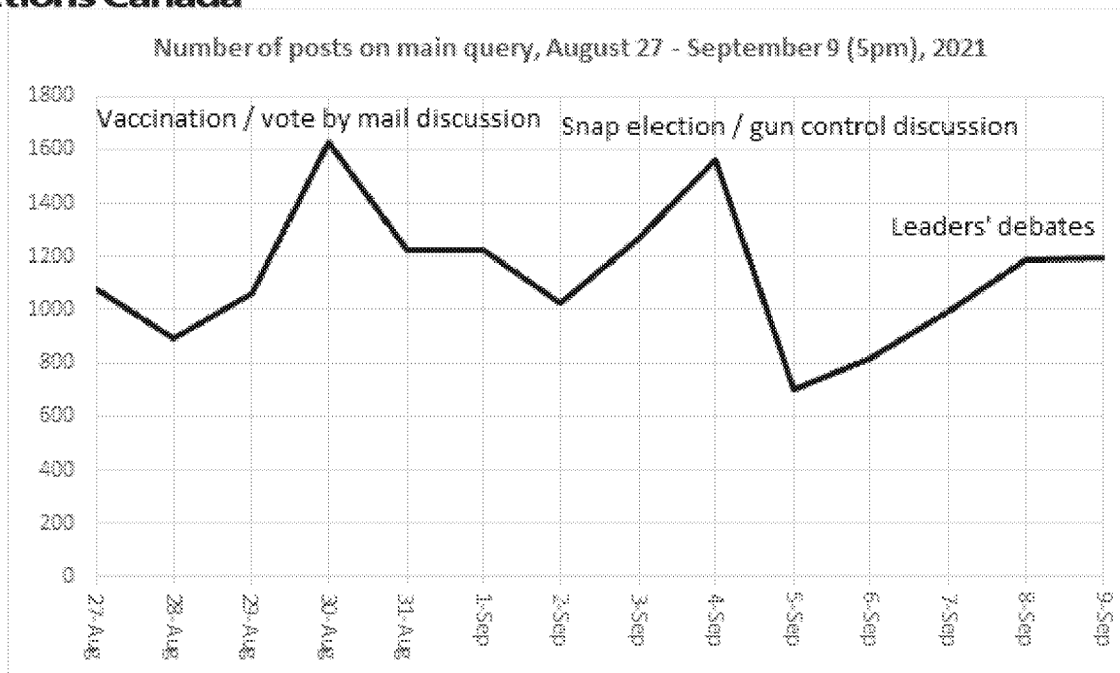

Éléments sous observation / On the radar

Claims of foreign interference from China boosting the LPC following news of the CPC platform

On Sep. 8th, The Hill Times posted an article with expert opinions on the Canada-China relationship. According to the article, the CPC have 31 references to China in their platform with a handful of additional references to Beijing and the Chinese Communist Party which could lead to Beijing retaliation, while the LPC platform has only one reference to China alongside Iran and Russia. Business in Vancouver posted an article on the same day, claiming the Chinese Communist Party is promoting the LPC through Vancouver residents supportive of the CCP using WeChat (China's state-monitored social media platform) and WhatsApp. The WeChat articles referenced generally show support for the LPC, criticize the CPC on China related issues and show indifference toward the NDP. They invoke racial unity and support for the Chinese government. Many Chinese language articles encourage people of Chinese ancestry to vote to promote their interests and highlight Chinese-Canadian candidates from all parties.

Candidate for Richmond Hill claims fraud will occur in GE44 through vote by mail, DVS

In a video titled *What's one thing Elections Canada won't tell you to bring to the polling site but that you should bring anyway?* A candidate for Richmond Hill has told electors to bring a pen to avoid someone to "erase a pencil mark from a ballot and replace it in favour of the 'Correct' candidate." The candidate went on to claim "the fact that they are using the mail in voting and the Dominion voting machines to count the ballots... But at least if you bring a pen, then you are going to be able to say that you have done everything you could to protect Canadian democracy."

Misinformation about voting by mail continues to be prominent in the environment with the constant comparison to the US tainting the discussion. Social media conversations about electoral integrity frequently bring up vote by mail and the alleged use of voting machines in tandem when theorizing about how the election could be rigged by utilizing pandemic health measures. An anti-lockdown social media influencer and activist has encouraged others to write his own name in on their ballot for a third time, in this case with more prominent pushback from followers who do not wish to spoil their ballot. Many social media users still insist on spoiling their ballots or refuse to vote and display signs of being 'black-pilled' into believing elections are totally corrupt and 'the system' is irredeemable.



Electors who plan on voting in person are split over whether advance polls or election day is the most secure way to ensure their vote. Those in favour of advance polls cite the convenience as well as misinformation that people may not be able to vote in person on election day due to the pandemic. Proponents of election day voting are skeptical of what happens to ballot boxes between advance polls and election day. In all cases we are observing a rise in people encouraging voting with ink out of concern that Elections Canada is corrupt or partisan.

Electors continue to speculate over the reasons for delays in receiving their VICs including theories that there is a partisan logic to the distribution. An article about electors being deadnamed on their VICs encouraged many people to come forward with their own stories, including issues in polling places and being made to feel uncomfortable by staff when they try to get issues resolved. Recipients also frequently highlighted accessibility issues with their assigned polling places including if the locations were within driving but not walking distance.
