Social Media Monitoring Report: September 15, 5pm – September 16, 5pm, 2021

Observations principales / Key observations

- Volume: **Last 24h: 1.73K posts/day; Previous 7 days average: 1.68K; Previous 30 days average: 1.44K**
- Vote by mail is still a leading topic today due to concerns over potential delays in electoral results. Concerns over the delay has been fuelled by a journalist tweet suggesting it might be intentional.
- New provincial public health measures created confusion in the environment especially regarding vaccine passport requirements to access polling locations.
- Former POTUS Barack Obama tweeted his support to the leader of the LPC; the tweet produced strong reactions and accusations of illegal foreign interference in Canadian elections.
- Access to the polls for people isolating due to COVID-19 has been a major topic in the past 24 hours. Demands for EC to provide more options are common as articles discussing the issue are released.

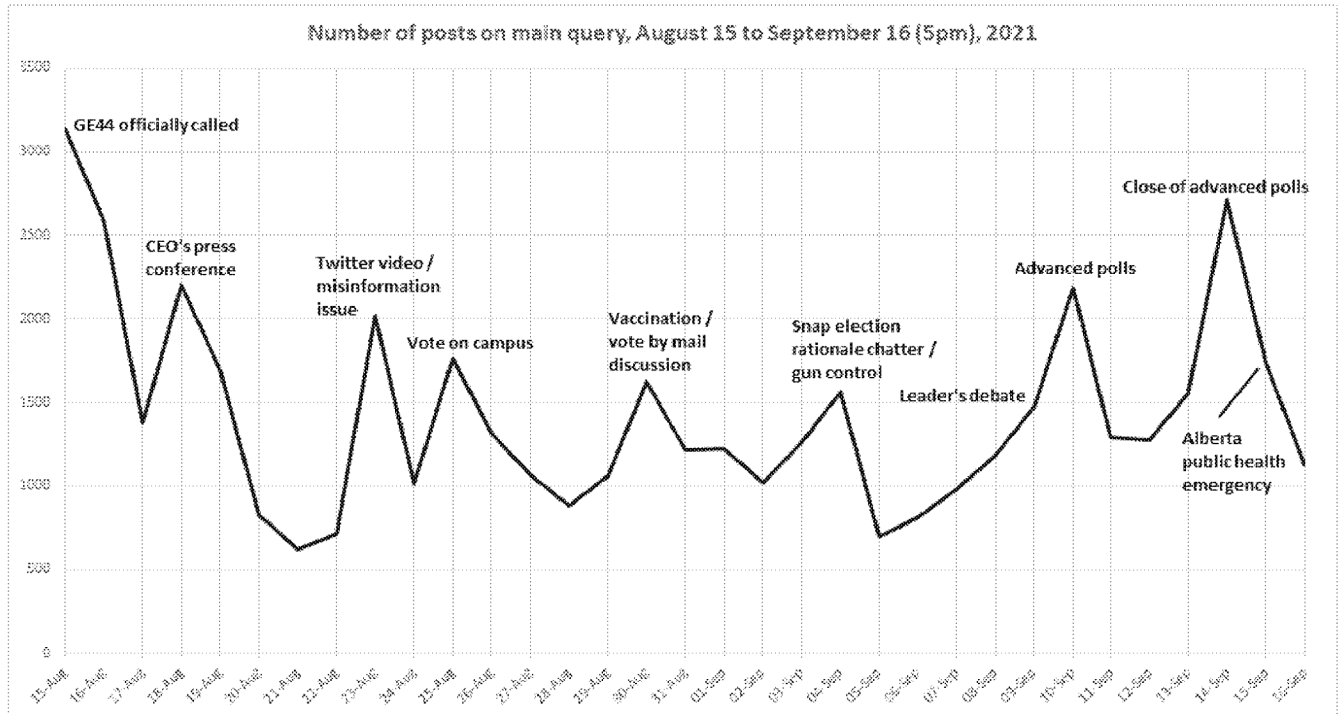
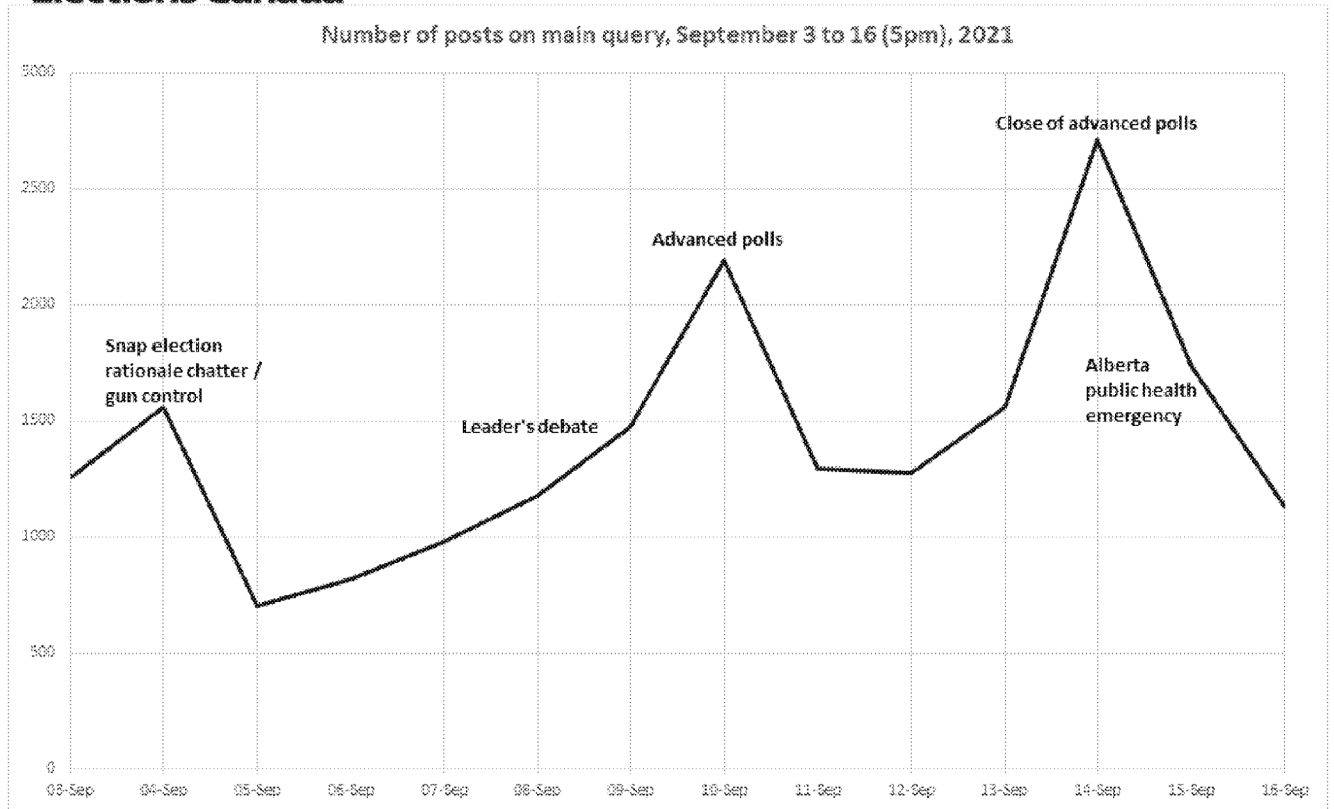

Éléments sous observation / On the radar

Former President Obama tweets support for LPC leader, prompting accusations of foreign interference

Similar to what happened in GE43, on September 16, 2021 former president Barack Obama posted a tweet wishing good luck to the leader of the LPC for the election [over 97K engagements]. The tweet led to strong reactions, mostly accusations of foreign interference. Several Canadian outlets reported the news. Reactions to these were mostly partisan, with many accusations of interference and lack of restraint.

After Alberta, Saskatchewan announces mandatory masking and vaccination pass measures

After the announcement of new public health measures in Saskatchewan on September 16 and in Alberta on the 15th, several users have expressed their concerns regarding reduced access to polling stations. One of the main sources of concern is related to vaccine passports. This brought back a main narrative to the forefront: theories that vaccine passports would be put in place at the last hour in an attempt to control the outcome of the election (allegations of voter suppression and of EC being corrupt in favour of the LPC).

Sinophone media reporting use of single-use pencils in GE43

On September 16, more than 10 separate Chinese-language articles, totaling more than 400 reactions, reshared a story about single-use pencils that they presented as “reported by KESQ-TV, an affiliate of ABC News.” The article stated that millions of pencils were procured by EC for this election, but that there were worries about pencil marks getting smudged and spoiling ballots. There were also worries that ballots marked with pencils were easier to modify, sparking concerns about electoral fraud. However, the articles also included clarification from EC that smudged ballots can be counted as long it’s clearly marked beside a candidate’s name, and that voters are free to use their own writing utensil. The post that generated the highest number of reactions was questioning the magnitude of this Canadian election fraud, and compared GE44 to the US election involving Biden’s “army of the dead” and Dominion.

A resurgence in the topic of vote by mail continues as election day draws near and Canadians worry about how long it will take to count mail-in ballots and announce results, and whether mail-in ballots will impact projected results. Following EC's statements and several news article on the topic of potential delays in the electoral results, many users questioned the reasons behind the delays. One journalist in particular openly questioned EC's motivation, leading to very strong reactions doubting the integrity of the election and the electoral process. The post was massively shared on September 15 and 16. There are rampant theories that delays are necessary to allow time for EC to rig the results in the favour of the LPC. As has been observed previously, many of these accusations bring up the U.S. election and the alleged use of Dominion Voting Machines to support their arguments that the election will involve fraudulent ballots, including by deceased voters.

Following the announcement of the public health measures in Alberta, conversation and confusion regarding access to polling stations has gained traction again. More importantly, we have noticed a sharp increase in confusion or concerns about vaccine requirements to vote in person. However, many users seem aware that it is not required, commenting accordingly. Vaccine passport concerns has more or less eclipsed mask mandates as the main concern about voting in person. The few users still commenting on the issue were sharing how they voted maskless without resistance from poll workers.

Users retelling their advance polls experiences were still prevalent today. Long lineups stories were still commonly found in comment sections, as were predictions that it would be worst on Election Day. Some quoted EC on lineups and shared concerns on the polling stations operations. Often in the same discussion threads, users discussed the bad treatment that some poll workers were or will be subjected to.

Reactions to the tweet former U.S. President Barack Obama sent in support of the LPC leader were mostly relegated to partisan banter, however many comments also accused Obama of engaging in foreign interference. This situation is remarkably similar to a similar tweet posted in the last days of GE43. Some of the commenters went on to suggest that the whole election is rigged and that the message of support belied an even greater collusion between Canada and the U.S. and the “rigged democratic elections.”

After CTV News reported on the possibility that some electors won't have access to polling stations because of COVID-19 and quarantine, volume on this issue has increased significantly; reactions were exclusively negative. Some users questioned why EC did not prepare for this possibility and offered an option for people with COVID-19 to vote at separate polling stations, different lines or a "curbside" option. Stronger reactions questioned the integrity of the election and the legality of public health measures enforced by EC or accused EC of voter suppression. One user made a link between this and the NL elections, as another example of an illegitimate election.

Section 3's exemption from Section 33 provides extra legal protection to the right to vote and it may prevent Parliament or the provincial governments from disenfranchising any Canadian citizen for ideological or political purposes, among others.
