

Rapport de repérage des médias sociaux: du 18 septembre 17h au 19 septembre 17h 2021 Social Media Monitoring Report: September 18, 5pm – September 19, 5pm, 2021

Observations principales / Key observations

- Volume: Last 24h: 978; Previous 7 days average: 1.7K posts/day; Previous 30 days average: 1.34K posts/day; pre-campaign average: 100 posts/day
- Frustrations over the lack of options for COVID positive electors and concerns over voting in person are frequently aired, with some questioning the safety of voting in person.
- Some users criticized EC's alleged lack of preparation for electors with COVID and its poor response on the issue. This led some to go as far as calling EC's action voter suppression or an attempt to reduce turnout.
- Social media users are worried about ballots arriving in time to be counted, as well as the amount of time it will take to do count ballots, many believe a delay of more than one day would signal foul play by EC.





On the eve of the election, mail-in ballots and voting machines are once again closely linked in the social media environment, some content shows signs of targeted amplification. Contrary to GE43, narratives at this point tend not to emphasize the number of ballots prepared vs the number of electors but instead focus on the number of days it will



take to count and announce the results. A large contingent of skeptics who have emerged since the 2020 US presidential election believe that use of vote by mail facilitates vote rigging and corrupt elections. Others are open to trusting election results, but caution others to vote in person and want a quick result that mirrors their expectations. Delays or results that differ from their beliefs will, in their opinion, prove that results are fabricated.

Electors are still concerned about accessibility for individuals with COVID-19 who won't be able to make it to the polls on election day. Many described it as voter suppression and call for measures to be put in place like voting outside polling stations. Some call out EC for not preparing enough for this and for its poor response when questioned on the matter. Some also suggest not getting tested before election day to ensure their right to vote or simply lie and go to the polls regardless. Regarding polling station operations, concerns over long line ups, voter health and safety, and the reduced number of polling stations are still prevalent. In a few posts or comments, users describe risks and obstacles in an apparent attempt to reduce voter turnout. One called for people who test positive to COVID-19 next week to file a lawsuit against the LPC for calling the election.
